

# METRICH raid in Plymouth nets drugs, cash

Detectives found more than \$7,000 worth of prescription drugs and 2 pounds of marijuana in a raid of a Plymouth residence late Wednesday.

Around 10:45 p.m. Wednesday, the METRICH Enforcement Unit, with the assistance from the Allied Special Operations Response Team and the Plymouth Police Department, searched 90 E. Main St. in Plymouth.



The search warrant was the result of a lengthy drug investigation conducted by the Plymouth Police Department and METRICH, a 10-county decentralized task force focused on reducing the availability of illegal drugs and weapons.

During the search, detectives seized 179 oxycodone tablets with an estimated street value of \$7,160.00, numerous other prescription pills, nearly 2 pounds of marijuana, suspected magic mushrooms, a handgun and over \$9,000.00 cash.

Guy W. Brown, 28, who lives at the residence, was charged with second degree felony drug possession and fifth degree felony possession of marijuana. Further charges are expected after completing an analysis of the other pills.

METRICH Commander Lt. Joseph D. Petrycki said in a news release the Plymouth Police Department did an excellent job on the investigation and that the METRICH Enforcement Unit will continue to target those who traffic drugs anywhere in Richland County.
