

Findlay man arrested after drug searches

A Findlay man was arrested and charged with drug crimes Thursday evening after two traffic stops and a search of a residence.

About 5 p.m., the Hancock County METRICH Drug Task Force, with assistance from Hancock County Sheriff's Office and Findlay Police Department K9s Axel and Asa, executed the traffic stops and search warrant at 1943 Breckenridge Rd. The traffic stops resulted in the seizure of \$2,200 cash that law enforcement have tied to drug trafficking, a release from the task force states.



Search of the residence yielded 44 grams of suspected methamphetamine, 14 grams of cocaine, 52 Suboxone strips and multiple items indicative of drug trafficking.

Terry Bayes, 60, was charged with two drug possession charges, one a second-degree felony and the other a third-degree felony. He was taken to the Hancock County Justice Center where he remained Friday. His bail was set at \$25,000.

Additional charges of drug trafficking, possession of drugs are expected at the conclusion of this investigation.

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
